TESTIMONY

Though I was raised in a nominal Lutheran household with a basic understanding of Christianity, I rejected this tradition at an early age. In my teenage years I embraced a number of deceptive philosophies and practices to fill the void.

At the age of sixteen I became enamored with Scientology, believing that religion would be my key to happiness and success. My high school English teacher, Brian Dent (who was also a Baptist pastor), noticed me reading *Dianetics* by L. Ron Hubbard and cautiously offered to share with me “the other side of that.” However, I was hardened to his suggestion and went about my way deeper into Dianetics and Scientology.

Strangely enough, at a science fiction convention later that year I stumbled upon a book entitled *L. Ron Hubbard: Messiah or Madman?* I read the book in one weekend. Written by an ex-Scientologist and L. Ron Hubbard, Jr., the book exposed the hypocrisy, fraud, and deceit of the Church of Scientology. I felt like a child who had just been told there was no Santa Claus. My hope in that New Age religion had crumbled with nothing to replace it—except, of course, Brian Dent’s “old-fashioned” religion.

I called Brian Dent at home and told him I found a book that would probably change my life. When I told him what happened, he invited me to his home after school the next evening and there he shared the gospel of Jesus Christ with me—that God would accept me based on Christ’s work alone, by grace through faith, that I didn’t need to do good works, follow a ritual, or earn His favor. That spring evening of 1990, I accepted the Lord Jesus as my Savior. Had Brian shared the gospel with me one week earlier or one week later, I do not believe I would have accepted that message, but in His sovereignty, God worked all things together for good (Rom 8:28).

That summer I began growing steadily in my new faith. I was baptized with a number of friends with whom I had the opportunity to share Christ. We joined Old Scenic Community Church of Little Fork, Minnesota, and served the Lord in that setting. By my first year of Junior College, however, I felt a call to train for full-time Christian ministry. I transferred to Philadelphia Biblical University (now Cairn University), met my wife, Stephanie, was married, and then attended Dallas Theological Seminary.

All along the way since my conversion to Christ, my faith has grown—sometimes rapidly, usually through trial and struggle. But throughout the journey He has been exceedingly faithful, and I trust He will continue to work in me as I seek to serve Him.
